Smoke Alarm Safety Tips

- -Smoke alarms should be installed in every bedroom, outside each sleeping area, and on every level of the home.
- -Purchase alarms that have the label of a nationally-recognized testing laboratory.
- -For the best protection, smoke alarms should be interconnected so that they all sound if one sounds.
- -Test smoke alarms every month by pressing the TEST button.
- -Replace batteries at least once a year or sooner if an alarm "chirps" or "beeps" to indicate low battery.
- -Occasionally dust or lightly vacuum the exterior of the alarm to remove dust and cobwebs.
- -Replace all smoke alarms at least every 5 or 10 years.

TIME TO OPEN SWIMMING POOLS: Spring is here which means people will be thinking about opening up their swimming pools for the summer. Please remember that all pools must have a 4-foot barrier around them to protect children from accidental drowning.

DON'T HAVE YOUR CAR TOWED Please keep all vehicles licensed and in good running condition. The Village Council has given me the authority to have vehicles towed if they do not meet the requirements under Ordinance 12 - 05 and Zoning Regulation 520. Several vehicles have already been towed at a cost of about \$150 per vehicle to the property owner. The property owner is also responsible for the storage cost of that vehicle. If you need extra money, and have a junk vehicle, you can have it towed to the salvage yard and sell it for scrap.

GET A ZONING PERMIT All structures, including sheds, require a zoning permit. Be sure to contact me to get that permit prior to placing a new structure on your property. The permit process is not difficult. If you have questions about these issues, or questions about other zoning matters, you can call me at 937-475-2409.
